**L105 Target Audience:** This course is intended for newly appointed emergency managers from state, local, tribal, territorial, and federal emergency management agencies, and prospective professionals transferring from another discipline to emergency management.

Prerequisites: IS-29 Public Information Officer Awareness

**L-388 Target Audience:** The Advanced Public Information Officer course is for public information officers with a minimum of two (2) years' experience as a fulltime public information officer and for whom have completed the pre-requisites.

**Prerequisites**: Participants must have a **minimum of 2 years** of public information experience and provide proof of completion of the below courses.

- **IS-13** EMI Conduct and Behavior
- **IS-29** Public Information Officer Awareness
- IS-42 Social Media in Emergency Management
- **IS-100** Introduction to Incident Command System (ICS) (or ICS course for specific specialty: healthcare, public works, etc.)
- IS-200 Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response
- IS-247 Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS) for Alert Originators
- **IS-700** National Incident Management System, An Introduction
- IS-800 National Response Framework, An Introduction
- IS-2900 National Disaster Recovery Framework Overview
- E/L/K 105 Public Information Basics (no substitutions or waivers)
